SUBJECT: SHOCK ABSORBER DAMAGE DUE TO VIOLENT

STANDING STARTS

A number of cases have been reported where rear shock absorbers have been damaged due to violent acceleration from rest, i.e., clutch released at high engine speeds on take off.

In order to reduce the risk of damage on cars which are driven in this manner, it is recommended that torque reaction rubbers are fitted as follows:-

- 1) Jack up car.
- 2) Remove and discard second leaf clip and rubber liner from the forward end of N/S rear road spring.
- 3) Remove all traces of foreign matter from the top surface of the spring for approximately 12 ins. (30 cms.) from the forward end.
- 4) Fit the torque reaction rubber, second and third plate in the position shown using bolts and nuts provided.
- 5) Repeat procedure on O/S spring.
- 6) Remove jack.
